can take me to a quieter area.



I might need to be patient and wait my turn or share with other children.

I can play in another area while I wait.





My caregiver will stay with me while I

play in the Museum.



I keep my shoes on when I play in the

Museum.



Downstairs I see lots of places I can play. I see a tractor, a big cow and chickens and pigs in the barn that I

can play with. I can play with the tractor and trains and in a farm house.







I can have a tea party.

I can play downstairs and I can play upstairs too.

To play upstairs, I can climb up the stairs or take the elevator and go up.







The Museum has bathrooms downstairs and upstairs that I can use.



I can bring a snack from home to eat if I get hungry. I can eat my snack at the snack table in the lobby upstairs

or at the table in front of the Museum.





Upstairs in Water World I can climb and play. I can play with puzzles too.







In Main Street I can play in the Post Office and in Doc Weems' Office

where there are lots of babies to play with.







I can play in the Murray's General Store and even drive the car.
